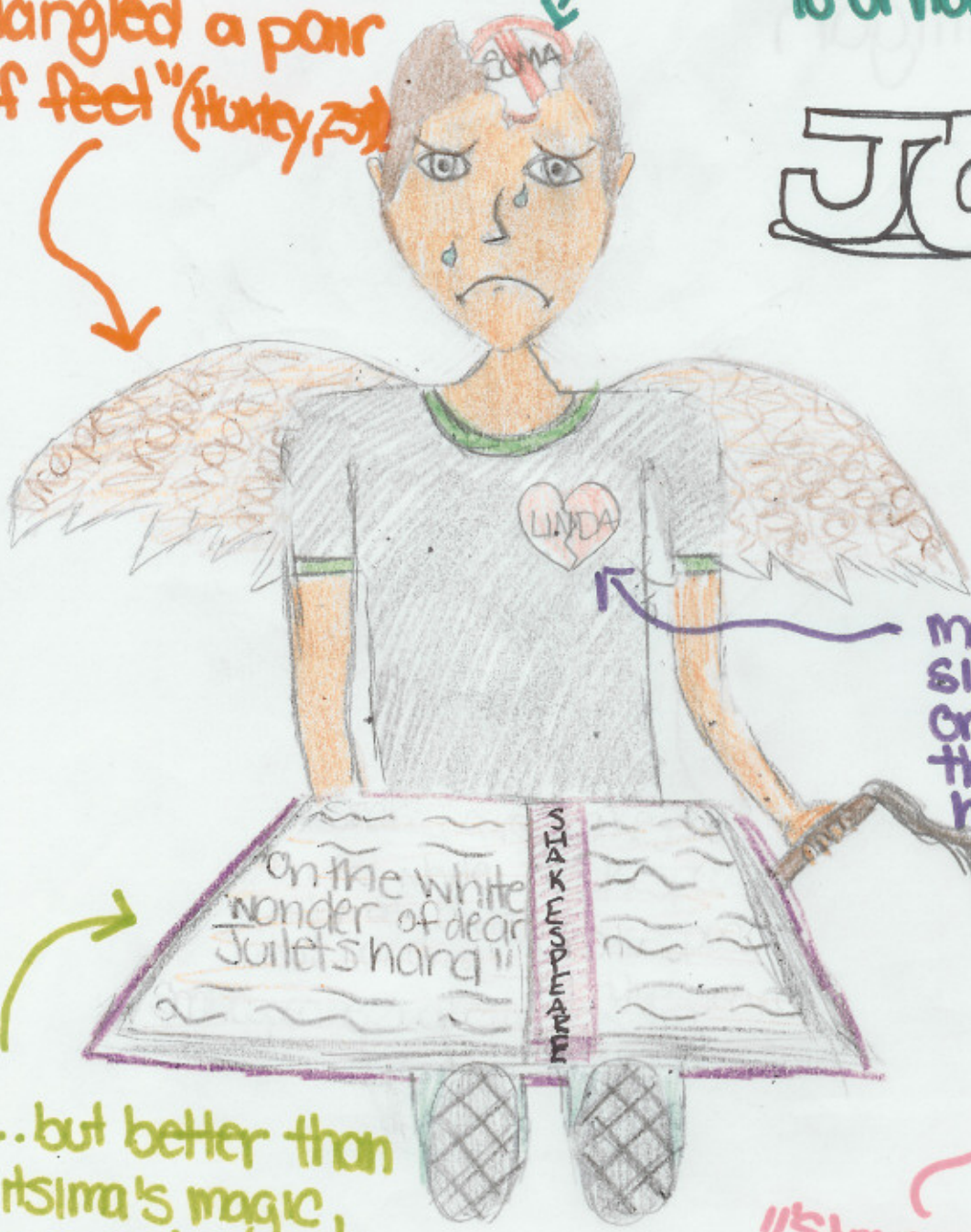


"Just under the crown of the arch dangled a pair of feet" (Huxley, 25)
